## For Such A Time As This

When a surprising turn of events lands a young Jewish woman named Esther in a position of importance, it becomes clear that she was meant for something very significant. An evil plan hatched by the king's closest advisor spells doom for the Jewish people, and Esther must risk her life to save them or suffer silently as they are wiped off the planet. Is she prepared for such a time as this? Are you?

The Almighty gave us special celebrations throughout the year to teach us about him and his Word. These feasts remind us of important events in the past, show us the beauty of the Messiah and his sacrifice, and reveal the glory of what is to come in the future. YeHoVaH commands us to keep his feasts in the 23rd chapter of Leviticus.

Purim, however, celebrated during the last week of this month, is different because it is a historical celebration. It is not among those commanded in the Bible. Still, it serves to remind us of what YeHoVaH's people do in the face of persecution and adversity. Purim commemorates the events told in the book of Esther, when the brave actions of one woman saved her people. The story of Purim is a reminder to stay true to our Elohim and stand up for what we believe.

On Purim, we make a festive occasion of reading the whole megillah (scroll) of Esther. We gather friends and family and have fun with it. Everyone makes sound effects — booing for Haman and cheering for Hadassah (Esther). Then discussion ensues: How we can apply the same traits Mordechai and Esther demonstrated in our own walks of faith today?

Will we be able to stand strong in the face of adversity like Esther did?

The Messiah tells us that there will always be people to fight against us, but if we learn from the story of Purim and stay strong in our faith, our reward in Heaven will be great. Before the Messiah's return, we know hard times are coming. We will be tested, and we must be ready.

### This Month In Gospel History:

## The Mikveh

This month marks an important milestone in biblical history. It was the 20th day of the 11th month on the Hebrew calendar (February 16, 27CE) that Yochanan (aka John the Baptist) "mikveh-ed" Yeshua in the Jordan River – beginning his 70-week ministry.

The word "baptize" is a transliteration of the Greek word baptidzo, which is laden with pagan connotations. Yochanan was doing that with which every Israelite was familiar from birth, the "mikveh," which literally means "running water" and was part of the ongoing practice of repentance, cleansing, and renewal. The mikveh is always complete immersion in running water and was most often done in private. The mikveh is unrelated to the pagan practice of baptism, which usually consists of sprinkling water upon the initiate by a priest.

Just as Yeshua's mikveh in water marked the beginning of his earthly ministry, the mikveh of fire known as Shavuot or Pentecost is the new beginning. It fell on the first day of the week. It began the 71st week, and the 491st day after Yeshua commenced his ministry by his mikveh in the Jordan. Once the apostles were filled with the gift of the Ruach Kodesh at the Feast of Shavuot (a commemoration of the day that the Torah was shouted down from Mount Sinai), the Torah was written on their hearts and they received their orders directly from the resurrected Messiah - just as is stated in verse 2 of Luke's opening statement. On that momentous day, Shimon Kefa (Peter) revealed that this gift is available to everyone who calls on Yeshua's name.
